<u>Little Sir Report:</u> Our Guest Speaker for the April Luncheon is <u>Jason Balderama</u>. Jason is the Chief Information Security Officer at the County of Marin, has over 23 years of experience in government IT, including 8 years in cybersecurity. He earned the <u>Certified Information</u> <u>Systems Security Professional (CISSP)</u> certification in 2013 and remains a member in good standing with ISC2. Jason was instrumental in establishing the County's first-ever cybersecurity program in 2016, which has been continuously developed and matured under his guidance. Jason's efforts earned the Marin cybersecurity program the prestigious <u>California</u> Association of Counties (CSAC) Challenge Award in 2019.

Jason spearheaded the creation of the Marin Information Security Collaboration (MISC), a groundbreaking initiative that united the County and its cities and towns in cybersecurity efforts. This initiative evolved into the Marin Security and Privacy Council (MSPC) in 2022, expanding its membership to include public and private sector organizations across the County. The MSPC was subsequently recognized with the Collaboration Award at the State of California Cybersecurity Education Summit in 2022. Jason also championed community outreach by launching the Marin Cybersafe News cybersecurity newsletter in January 2022, providing valuable resources to all County residents.

Jason's contributions extend beyond local impact, as evidenced by his co-chair role in the Multi-State Information Sharing and Analysis Center (MS-ISAC) Security Awareness Work Group for the past four years and active participation in the Bay Area Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI). He is a frequent speaker at the California Counties Information Services Directors Association (CCISDSA) and is a key contributor to their Cybersecurity Work Group. Most recently, in March 2024, Jason partnered with the Bay Area UASI to host the region's first cybersecurity tabletop exercise at the Marin County Civic Center, further demonstrating his commitment to advancing cybersecurity collaboration and preparedness. It was labeled the largest and one of the best regional tabletop exercises in the state.

Turning Pages

"The Dark Wives" by Ann Cleeves: 2024 Fiction, mystery genre

Vera Standhope investigates the murder of a young man, a caretaker in a privately owned care home for disturbed teenagers. At the same time a fourteen-year-old girl has gone missing. Like most of the Vera novels the location is in Northumberland, a county in England near the Scottish border. The care home is on the coast, but much of the drama occurs inland, several hours drive away from the coast, in which location there stand three stone slabs on a hill, known as the "Dark Wives". The local town community makes much of the mystery of the three "witches". The story involves social services and why, when other such care homes are privately owned here by for-profit companies instead of local social services. Vera has her usual team of Joe and Charles and a new girl, Rosie, who replaces Holly, who was murdered in the previous novel. The narrative is in third person, like all of the Vera novels. The writing is in Cleeve's usual style delving into the personalities of all the characters. I recommend this to all readers of the genre. Vera books are always great reads.

"Midnight and Blue", by Ian Rankin; 2024. Crime/Thriller genre

John Rebus is in jail, found guilty of the attempted murder of Cafferty, former crime lord of Edinburgh. Innocent of the charge, he awaits his appeal. A con has been murdered in the adjoining cell and he and his former colleagues from outside are trying to solve the murder. Meanwhile, a fourteen-year-old girl has gone missing. The officers overlap in the two investigations: the usual suspects, Rebus's former friends and colleagues and one officer who is a friend to none.

This is a great read, as are all of Rankin's novels. He is amongst the best of the genre.

This month's restaurant review is of the MIJO Restaurant, located at 55 Tamal Vista Blvd. Corte Madera 94925.

A Spanish-California cuisine, now that's a new one – AND a good one!

What the heck is Spanish-Cali? Well, it's a mixed menu featuring Spanish style tapas with a California twist. What does that mean? I don't know, but its delicious selection of small plates fashioned after the popular and plentiful tapas bars of Madrid and Barcelona and throughout Spain.

The restaurant is at the site of the old Savannah Grill, Izzy's Steakhouse, Mosely's and others and the place has never looked better. There's a long full bar, counter seats, tables and high tops with an open kitchen in fun colorful décor. Outdoor seating for my dog too and plenty of parking. Bartenders and waitstaff are friendly and accommodation.

Fish, vegetable, meat and raw tapas are featured, but there are great entrees too – and a great paella.

My wife and I have gone twice and loved it — lively and fun atmosphere made us come back for tapas after sharing the paella. It's not cheap, but at this stage of our life our appetites are smaller than they once were so we can make do with a couple of tapas or a split dish and, of course, a glass of wine. I had the lollipop lamb chop tapa and Debbie had short rib stuffed with piquillo peppers — both were exceptional, and we got out of there for less than an arm and a leg and were very satiated.

It's only been open a couple of weeks so it's super popular right now, but you can still get in and if there's just two of you - sit at the bar/counter - it's lively and fun.
