Westport" by James Comey; 2025 Mystery/Thriller genre Nora Carelton has left her job two years before where she headed the U.S. Attorney's office for the southern district of New York. She lives in a very large house with her mother and sometimes with her 10 year old daughter, Sophie. Her ex, with whom she shares Sophie lives nearby. She had accepted a job in Westport, Conn. in a private, very successful hedge fund corporation as general counsel. The general manager, who is her boss, was found murdered with her throat cut in Nora's canoe, and that and other clues lead investigators to make her the prime suspect. She is being set up by a person unknown. Benny and an attorney associate from New York who were private investigators there, are called in to help, and Benny moves into her large house for her protection and to lead the investigative team, since the local police are not seeking another suspect.

This is a well- written, suspenseful thriller informed by Comey's extensive legal knowledge. It can stand alone, although the characters all were in his previous novel. I recommend it to those who like the genre.

# "The Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Pie Society", by Mary Ann Shaffer; 2008, Historical fiction genre

This is a story written entirely in letters amongst various people who are, or become known to the writer/author, Juliet, such as her old friend Sophie and her publisher, Sidney. The time frame of the story is 1946, only a year after Germany's surrender. Juliet discovers a ruse the townsfolk of St. Peter Port thought up when confronted by Nazi soldiers after curfew, returning from an illegal roast pig feast. They claimed that they were a book club (of the eponymous name) that met occasionally to discuss books. The absurd name convinces the Nazi soldiers, and they proceed .Upon learning about this, Juliet begins communication with book club members, finally moving there to write a book, and is captivated by the place and people. This is an historical account of the Nazi occupation: tragic, funny, poignant, mostly a love story. This novel received much well-eserved acclaim, such as one of the ten best books of the year from N.Y. Times. I cannot recommend it more highly.

KING OF THE ROLL

LARKSPUR, CA

I can't believe I haven't reviewed one of our most frequented restaurants. Although only a short walk from my house, we usually drive there, our bad!

King of the Roll is a sushi/teriyaki/Chinese/'whatever' food restaurant with a quaint and small indoor space and an outdoor patio with cheap plastic mix and match furniture. It's located in the former Lucky Supermarket on Magnola. The atmosphere is charming if you enjoy funky atmospheres with a unique personality. There is plenty of SIR's parking, so it's easy to get to.

The sushi is VERY good and fresh and there are TONs of sushi rolls to choose from, if that's the way YOU roll! For instance, the Queen Roll (one of our favorites) is particularly delicious with its combination of cooked salmon, grilled scallops, and crab. Debbie and I love the Vanna roll – named after the wife of owner John Wayne. The rolls are enough to fill you up – but there's are a lot of extra dishes to add: potstickers, shrimp dumplings Japanese chicken nuggets, etc.

If sushi isn't your thing, there is a full Japanese menu with all the usuals, like udon, and donburi, or teriyaki dishes like veggie-chicken-shrimp and much more. Wine, Saki and beer are also available and EVERYTHING is affordable – you can get out of there for under a hundred bucks for two with drinks.

I mentioned the owner, John Wayne, who is a real character and Vanna is a sweetheart. John insists that everything is extra fresh and he even delivers whole fresh fish dishes and other delicacies that that aren't even on the menu – just ask him what he suggests.

Try it, you'll like it. It's right on the old Larkspur railroad tracks at the station.

The next Sirs Poker Game is scheduled for Monday October 6, 2025




